You can explain your <b>Animal Project</b> with confidence, answering questions with detail and creativity.

<b>Communication</b>	Recording, organizing and presenting your ideas <b>orally and in written form</b> is challenging for you. We will continue to work on communicating your ideas more clearly so that they make sense.	You need some help to record, organize and present your ideas and information <b>orally and in written form</b> so that your ideas are communicated clearly and with detail.	You can record, organize and present your ideas and information <b>orally and in written form</b> clearly, independently and with detail and appropriate terminology.	You record, organize and present your ideas and information <b>orally and in written form</b> with creativity and correct terminology. Your ideas are communicated very clearly and in an interesting way.
