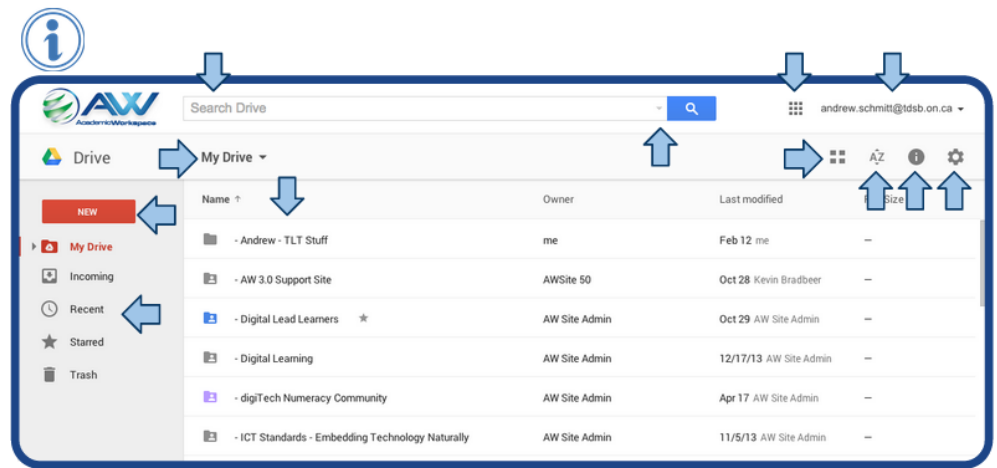
What is Google Drive?

Google Drive is a cloud storage service that allows you to store your documents, photos, videos, and more online. From **Drive**, you can also use **Google Apps** like Docs, Sheets, Presentation, Forms, and Drawings to create and edit various types of files.

Integration Ideas

Google Drive can be used to:

- Create a shared Google Folder with your class - all the apps created in this folder are automatically shared with the class
- Store electronic files eliminating the need for USB flash drives
- Collect student work and provide descriptive feedback
- Provide different levels of access to files and folders, for example, "comment only" access for students to a presentation or doc so they can interact with the content and each other without changing the actual content
