

## Cabins

There are three cabins—two small and one large. All cabins are located on the south side of the lake, with access to pit toilets. Showers and flush toilets are available on the north side of the lake.

Each cabin is equipped to accommodate four people and includes a propane stove, lights and fridge, a table with four chairs, dishes, cooking utensils and cutlery. Please bring your own sheets, blankets and pillows. A firepit and picnic table are also provided. There is no indoor plumbing, heat, or electricity. Cabin keys are obtained from the registrar or caretaker on the property upon arrival.

Cabins #1 and #2 have one room, two sets of bunk beds, kitchen facilities, a screened porch, and a wonderful view. Cabin #3 is larger, with two bedrooms (one with a double bed, one with two single beds), a separate living room/kitchen area and a screened porch.

Maximum stay: if you rent 1 cabin, 2 weeks  
if you rent 2 cabins, 1 week

Reservations will be accepted starting on the last Saturday in January.

Cabins can be rented, in the high-season, by the week (seven days only) from Saturday to Saturday. In the off-season, rental is by the day or week.

Cabins must be reserved and paid for in advance.

Cost depends on time of year, duration of stay, and size of cabin. Cabins are ineligible for reimbursement.

## Camping details

### Individual/family unit camping

A family unit is generally considered as up to two adults and up to four children. There may be a surcharge for additional people. Additional vehicles may be parked in a nearby designated area to avoid overcrowding at the sites.

Adults are responsible for and must supervise all members in their group. Children and teen members of the group must be in the company of their parents when using the property.

Reservations are not required for regular camping. You must register upon arrival.

Campers pay by cash or cheque on departure.

### Seasonal sites

Seasonal sites are available annually. A seasonal fee must be paid in advance. The season is from May 1 until Thanksgiving Monday. General rules regarding sponsorship and numbers apply. Only one family (same address) can utilize a seasonal site. Call OTF at 416.966.3424, 1.800.268.7061 or check out [www.otffeo.on.ca](http://www.otffeo.on.ca) for further details.

Pre-registration required. For student groups or other educational tours under teacher supervision, access is limited to weekdays during the school term.

### School group camping

## Campground rules

1. Campers must sign in at the office on arrival, pick their campsite, and return to complete registration as soon as possible. All visitors must register upon arrival.
2. Campers must choose a campsite that will not crowd a neighbour or block access to facilities. The registrar has the final say over the assignment of campsites. To avoid crowding campsites, additional vehicles or utility or boat trailers should be parked in overflow areas if the caretaker or registrar requests you to do so.
3. The beach is unsupervised. Children under 12 must have adult supervision at all times while at the beach.
4. Alcohol is permitted on the campgrounds, but its use must be confined to your registered campsite and to those of legal age. No alcohol consumption is permitted at the beach. These same rules apply to smoking (including cannabis). Consumption of cannabis will be permitted however, not in common areas within campgrounds such as beach, washrooms, trails, parking areas or roads. Privileges may be revoked in the event of offensive behavior and an order to leave the campground may be enforced.
5. Campfires are permitted only in prepared fire pits. Your fire must be under your care and control at all times and must be properly extinguished.
6. Respect the privacy of your neighbours. Use service buildings and not the lake for personal hygiene and washing clothes.
7. Dogs must be on leashes at all times. Campers must clean up after their dogs and minimize loud barking. Dogs are not allowed on the beach or in the service buildings.
8. Quiet time is 11:30 pm to 8:00 am. Please refrain from any activity that might disturb other campers. Generators allowed from 11:00 am - 5:00 pm. More information at camp office.
9. Radios are permitted, but the sound level must be reasonable. If your radio can be heard beyond your campsite, it is too loud and you will be asked to turn it down or off.
10. Respect all plant and animal life. The picking of wild flowers and removal of birch bark are not permitted. Do not feed the turtles.
11. Motorized vehicles are to be used only for transportation to and from the campground. No motors of any type, including electric trolling motors, are allowed on the lake. Wheeled vehicles are not allowed on the trails, for safety reasons.
12. Firearms are not permitted on the property and hunting is strictly prohibited.

## Consequences

Failure to abide by the Parry Sound Campground Rules could result in any of the following consequences:

1. A request from the caretaker or registrar to conform to the rules or to take specific action.
2. Written notification from the caretaker or registrar of a breach of rules and the possibility of expulsion.
3. An order to leave the campground.
4. Loss of camping privileges for a period of time to be determined by the OTF Secretary-Treasurer or designate.

Every effort will be made to ensure that campers have due process. None of the actions will be taken without an examination of the circumstances. Should step 3 become necessary, the staff is authorized to involve the Ontario Provincial Police if the situation warrants it.



## General information

Quinn Lake is the location of the campground near Parry Sound owned by the Ontario Teachers' Federation. Lovely grassy meadows provide clean, spacious campsites with easy access to a beautiful lake bordered by a mixed forest teeming with wildlife. Nature trails and quiet country roads provide ample opportunity for walking. The lake is ideal for swimming, fishing, canoeing or sailboarding. It's a safe place for kids, with lots of grass, sand and a roped-off beach (unsupervised). Motors of any kind are not permitted on the lake.

Space is set aside for baseball, horseshoes and volleyball. There are several golf courses within driving distance. Mutual respect has meant that loud radios are not a problem, so you can even curl up with a book under a shady tree!

Facilities include service buildings with flush toilets and hot showers, two large picnic pavilions and three rustic cabins. There are lots of picnic tables and firewood is available at a nominal fee. There are electrical hook-ups at 12 of the sites only. Seasonal sites are available annually. All teachers belonging to an OTF Affiliate, as well as other education workers in our schools—principals, secretaries, educational assistants, caretakers—are welcome.

A host registrar and caretaker service the property and are available to assist campers at posted times. The telephone at the registrar's cabin is for emergencies: 705.389.2540. There is a pay phone for outgoing calls.

## Driving directions

From Parry Sound, take Hwy 124 east towards Sundridge. Watch for the Dunchurch Canadian Legion Hall, situated at the corner of Hwy 124 and Balsam Road. Turn right at Balsam Road. Follow Balsam Road taking the right fork as the road divides. The OTF Campground sign will direct you to make a left turn on Pitt Road, leading to the Registrar's cabin.
