Pain Court teacher elected President

TORONTO, August 24, 2023 — The Ontario Teachers' Federation (OTF) Board of Governors elected Learnington (ON) resident and Pain Court (ON) teacher, Yves Durocher, as the 80th OTF President at its Annual Meeting on Tuesday, August 22, 2023.

Durocher has been in the teaching profession since 1998. He first taught in the Ottawa-Carleton District School Board before moving to the Conseil scolaire catholique Providence where he has been since 2003.

Yves has been an active and engaged member with l'Association des enseignantes et des enseignants franco-ontariens (AEFO) in which he served 12 years on its board of directors and eight years on its executive. He was also his district's local President from 2012 to 2016.

His teaching career and longtime advocacy guide his understanding of what this school year will entail. Durocher states, "OTF will continue to advocate for the resources and support needed to ensure a thriving classroom environment for both teachers and students."
